PASSPORTkids! Packing Checklist

What to Bring

- **Clothes:** T-shirts, shorts, modest swimsuit, 1 pair long pants, closed-toed shoes (Crocs do not count; tennis shoes are preferred), messy clothes for recreation, a sweatshirt or jacket for cool evenings.
See Dress Code below for more tips.
- **Towels** for showers and swimming and **Linens** (sleeping bags recommended, see Location for specifics about bedding)
- **Toiletries:** the usual. In addition, hand soap and towels for washing hands in the dormitory bathrooms.
- **Bible, pen/pencil**
- **Sunscreen** and **Bug Repellant**
- **Water bottle:** This is essential. We are not providing paper cups for water breaks. Campers must bring a water bottle to fill and use throughout the day.
- **Flashlight**
- A lightweight **backpack** or **tote bag**
- Some **money** for the snack bar, the camp store, and the mission offering

What Not to Bring

- Prank items like shaving cream or water balloons.
- Illegal drugs, tobacco products, firearms, or alcohol. These are not tolerated at camp.
- Electronic Devices: cell phones, mp3 players, portable DVD players, etc... must be switched off at camp. This is to help campers focus on God, camp, relationships, and themselves.

Dress Code

Campers should dress modestly and appropriately, according to their size and developmental stage, the entire week of camp.

- **Swimsuits:** All swimsuits should be modest. Girls may wear a t-shirt over two-piece suits. If campers are wearing swimsuits during other activities, they should wear clothing over them.
- **Worship Dress:** Campers who lead worship (reading scripture, singing, praying, etc.) should wear jeans, slacks, long dresses/ skirts, or modest shorts to worship. Campers who do not lead on stage may dress according to the general dress code.
