Before the events of the first Pentecost, which came a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church." I have been considering what I know about Pentecost. I know we are supposed to wear red, we hear the story about the flame coming down, the big wind, and speaking in tongues. Like other major occasions in the church calendar, we listen to the scripture, we sing, we hear a sermon, and we think we understand about the significance of Pentecost.

Do you remember when you first believed - when you first knew God? We all heard the stories from our parents and our Sunday School teachers, but when did you realize you believed in Jesus and when did the Holy Spirit come into your life? Do you remember the day - the time - where you were? Think about that for a minute. Was there a moment when your heart was "strangely warmed" as John Wesley said? Do you remember the moment when you were filled with the Holy Spirit? I hope you have had such an opportunity. If you're having trouble remembering the time, I would strongly recommend spending some quiet time communing with God and seeking to relive that moment.

I remember two things: One, was what my senior minister said to me in my Preparing for Baptism class when I was 10. He said that your conscience is the voice of God speaking to you in your heart. I'd always wondered whose voice that was - this explanation turned on a light. That was the first time I thought about God speaking to me every day, and it felt comforting. And the second time was when I was 19. I remember sitting in a concert in Jefferson City, Tennessee, and I know the Holy Spirit said to me, "go to your dorm room and ask Buddy (my roommate) if he knows the Heavenly Father". I could feel it, I just knew, the light that was turned on at 10 was burning much brighter in me. I also knew at that time, that God expected things from me - that I was walking with God - He had expectations of me, but I just didn't know exactly what. (By the way, Buddy asked Jesus into his heart that night.)

We are not all asked to do big things like form a church and change the world dramatically, but we are empowered to do the every day things that spread God's love in the world. Pentecost is the church's birthday – and we the church are the disciples – you and I are the church – Happy Birthday to you!

In celebration of the church's Pentecost birthday, June 9, let's all wear something red, which just happens to be the liturgical color for the day. There will be a fellowship gathering in the fellowship hall during the second half of the Sunday School period. We'll have a collection of treats available accompanied by coffee, juices, and tea.
